Voter Turnout Experiment(VTE)

What is the best way to increase voter turnout among residential college students? DL students who choose to participate in this year-long project, open exclusively to Democracy Lab participants, will act as "study assistants" in a campus-wide field experiment aimed at answering this question. You will:

- Receive training and certification in ethical conduct of research with human subjects
- Recruit Mason students to participate in the study
- Randomize participants into treatment groups and administer "treatments" intended to affect students' likelihood of voting
- Administer pre- and post-surveys to participants
- · Help with data organization and analysis

This project is a lesson in social science research design, causal reasoning, data management, experimental design, political participation, and collaborative research. If you log sufficient hours in the project, you'll be invited to help us publish the findings. **Professor Victor** leads this project and it's supported by **Professor Ashley Jardina** and **PhD student Tim Bynion**. *You must attend the interest meeting on 8/26 if you want to participate in the VTE*.
